This annual, online only giving event is an extraordinary opportunity designed to bring our communities together to raise money and awareness for participating local nonprofits!



WHO DO WE SUPPORT? ALICE

ALICE stands for Asset Limited, Income Constrained. Employed. These are individuals and families who earn above the federal poverty level, but not enough to afford the basic cost of living in their communities.

ALICE households often struggle to cover essentials like housing, childcare, food, transportation, and healthcare, despite working, sometimes multiple iobs.

They are our childcare providers, home health aides, cashiers, teachers, and delivery drivers - essential workers who keep our communities running but face tough financial decisions every day.

HOW WE INVEST

GETTING STARTED

If you would like to start a campaign at your workplace, UW Valleys will provide the tools that you need for planning and implementing a campaign. With the help and guidance of staff, you can run a successful campaign, even if you haven't participated in the past.

You will be most successful by offering employees the option of having a modest amount deducted from their check each pay period. Most businesses then send payments to UW Valleys on a monthly or quarterly basis.



DAY OF CARING

Day of Caring is an annual day of action that connects teams of corporate volunteers with nonprofits from across Dunn & Pepin counties. Volunteer teams roll up their sleeves and provide much-needed manpower to complete a half day project they're assigned to at local nonprofit agencies.

DIAPER BANK



Access to a sufficient supply of diapers is essential for the health of infants and toddlers, but too many families do not have the resources to adequately provide for this basic need. UW Valleys partners with local organizations to help build the diaper supply network in our region

(Dunn, Pierce, and Polk counties) that have extremely limited or no resources available. UW Valleys provides no-cost diapers and wipes for children in need.

THE JOHN COUGHLIN

The John Coughlin Hope Fund (JCHF) provides onetime financial assistance to individuals and families facing urgent needs when no other resources are available. Support may include help with rent, security deposits, mortgage payments, utilities, medical bills, car repairs, and other essential expenses.

JCHF works in partnership with local agencies to identify those experiencing short-term financial crises, ensuring all existing community resources are considered before funding is provided.
